

Through the Eyes of Youth: Life and Death in the Będzin Ghetto

We often frame the activities during the Holocaust in roles such as perpetrator (someone who oppresses another), victim (someone who is oppressed), resistor (someone who fought back covertly or overtly), and bystander (someone who stood by and did nothing). People played these roles in different ways and sometimes moved between them.
